DRUG AND ALCOHOL SERVICES

There are three direct drug and alcohol services in the Scottish Borders. Individuals can request a key worker of the same sex if they prefer, and services will aim to meet this requirement where possible.

- Injecting Equipment/Blood Borne Virus Tests
- Take Home Naloxone Kits
